2007 Budget Votes: 10%

- **Day 1**: 6 votes on pork spending budget amendments offered by House Democrats. We scored YES votes on the motions to table as the pro-growth vote.
- Day 2: 12 votes on budget amendments. 5 were pork spending projects, 4 would have stripped the income tax cut, 2 would have increased legislators pay, and one was to push Department of Education money away from the bureaucracy and into the classroom. We scored YES votes on the motions to table as the pro-growth votes for the first 11 proposals, and a YES vote for passage as the pro-growth vote on the Mulvaney education amendment.
- **Day 3**: 10 budget amendment votes: 2 for pork spending projects, and 8 Democrat attempts to strip out the income tax and spend the money on projects instead. In all ten cases, we scored the YES vote to table the amendments as the pro-growth vote.

DOT Restructuring: 10%

- **Gas Tax**: we scored a YES vote to table the proposed gas tax increase (of 5 cents per gallon) as the pro-growth vote.
- **Ott Amendment**: we scored a YES vote to table the amendment as the pro-growth vote. The amendment would have stripped Executive Branch authority from the DOT Commission
- **Edge Amendment**: we scored a NO vote to table the amendment at the pro-growth vote. The amendment would have moved the DOT entirely under Executive Branch authority rather than leave a quasi-legislative agency in charge.

EOS (15%): We scored a NO vote to table the school choice amendment as the pro-growth vote. The amendment would have given parents a tuition tax credit to send their children to private schools, and would have given tuition vouchers for parents whose children are trapped in public schools with a "D" or "F" designation.

Lard List (50%): We scored a vote to uphold the Governor's veto as the pro-growth vote for all fifty items we had identified for our Lard List. Each vote was worth 1% of our scores. We also deducted 1 point for any member who originally voted for a Lard List item, but then made a motion to "reconsider" that earlier vote. Only the reconsidered votes were counted in those instances.

Judicial (15%): we scored a vote for **Bruce Williams** for Supreme Court as the pro-growth vote, and a vote for Don Beatty as an anti-growth vote. The scorecard reflects the third and decisive ballot only.

Treasurer (+6% Bonus): we scored a vote to adjourn as a bonus vote, as we thought the process was flawed. We also scored a vote for **Greg Ryberg** as the pro-growth vote.
